- 2. We haven't had a historian for a while but there are numerous articles about the refuge or issues that we care about located in un-organized folders.
- 3. I have between 50 and 100 maps, charts and blue prints which could be indexed, stored properly, and archived if needed.
- 4. We need an updated herp and small mammal survey in the areas where we've been restoring habitat.
- 5. There's plenty of areas where someone could do habitat restoration. Of particular interest is an area where we found a vernal pool last year.
